Joe Biden's VP Pick Cements Shift to the Militant, Radically Anti-Gun Left

Springfield, VA – Gun Owners of America (GOA) Board Member Sam Paredes released the following after Democratic Presidential candidate Joe Biden announced Kamala Harris as his running mate:

“Joe Biden couldn't have done more to shift his campaign to the militant, anti-gun Left than by selecting California Senator Kamala Harris to join his run for the White House.

“Ironically, while Senator Harris tries to champion the ‘little guy,’ she has supported gun laws that have been used to deny honest individuals their right to keep and bear arms.

“Senator Harris’ record on the Second Amendment should be viewed as a direct threat to every gun owner in the country. Both her words and actions as an elected politician reveal the extreme objective of her politics.”

Consider Harris’ record on the right to keep and bear arms:

- Harris supports using the power of the presidency to impose gun control measures. She unapologetically stated that she would take executive action on gun control if Congress didn't toughen federal gun control policy.
- Harris supports a forced buyback of semi-automatic firearms.

- Harris said she would ban states from enacting “stand your ground” laws.

- Tweeted she would “revoke the licenses of gun manufacturers & dealers that break the law, require anyone who sells more than 5 guns/yr to run a background check on all gun sales, and ban the importation of AR-15-style assault weapons.”

- While Attorney General in California, Harris supported the ban on sales of almost all semi-automatic centerfire rifles and required that all existing semi-auto rifles be registered as California “Assault Weapons.”

- Also during her tenure as Attorney General, she fought to preserve the “good cause” requirement which allows the state to prevent a qualified individual from carrying concealed.

“The media quickly began their fawning over Harris as a ‘pragmatic moderate’ and ‘having a centrist’ record, but the pro-gun community stands in sharp opposition to the gun-control agenda of Vice President Joe Biden and Kamala Harris,” Paredes concluded. “Their absence of knowledge about the Constitution and the honest community of gun owners in the USA is unconscionable and ignorant.”

There's Just One NRA A-Rated Democrat Left In Congress

The most endangered species in Washington, D.C. isn't the panda bear. It's a pro-Second Amendment Democratic congresscritter. The NRA's Political Victory Fund has released its grades of candidates in the 2020 elections, and just one single, solitary Democratic member of Congress received an “A+” from the Second Amendment group. Minnesota Democrat Collin Petersen, who has represented the state's 7th Congressional District since 1991, not only received the highest grade that the NRA offers, he also has the official endorsement of the organization.

That's not surprising, given the NRA's pro-incumbent policy, though the group did give Petersen's Republican opponent, former Lt. Governor Michelle Fischbach, a slightly lower “A” grade as well.

As the Michael Bloomberg-backed website The Trace notes, however, the real story is that pro-Second Amendment Democrats have become an endangered species in Congress over the past decade. As recently as 2010, fully 25% of congressional Democrats received the highest rating from the NRA. Now, it's less than 1%, with more than 90% of Democrats getting an “F” from the gun rights organization.

The Trace says this is “a snapshot of America's widening political polarization,” but really it's just clear evidence that Democrats have abandoned support for the right to keep and bear arms as the Democratic Party itself has embraced a sweeping anti-gun agenda that's alienated many traditional Democrats.

Later today on Bearing Arms' Cam & Co, you can watch my interview with Jerry Wayne, the Detroit-area union member who confronted Joe Biden about his hostility towards the right to keep and bear arms. Wayne says that many rank-and-file union members have been left cold by the anti-gun stance of the Democratic Party, and he believes that, despite the endorsements for Biden by many unions, the actual members won't be voting blue this November.

I believe it, and Democrats have only themselves to blame. As a Second Amendment supporter, I've always believed that our rights are more secure when members of both parties back our right to self-defense, and though I'm a conservative, it would be nice to feel like I had a truly difficult decision to make when choosing between the Democrat or Republican in the voting booth.

Those days are gone, at least for now, though I still suspect that Democrats are going to eventually have to reckon with the fact that the party wants to re-invent policing and the criminal justice system, while putting an ever-increasing number of gun control laws on the books that turn the exercise of a constitutional right into a criminal offense. If the Left honestly believes that the criminal justice system is inherently biased, then every new gun law that criminalizes the Second Amendment is disproportionately used to put minorities in prison, many of whom have no serious criminal record. Ultimately Democrats are going to have to decide what they despise more; our nation's law enforcement or our constitutionally protected right to keep and bear arms.

Democrat Candidates Reject Our Gun Rights

All of the Democrat candidates in Missouri that have a voting record, with one exception, have a D or F rating. The one exception has a C rating.

All of the Democrat candidates in Missouri without a voting record, with one exception, did not return the NRA questionnaire. I guess that candidate did not get the marching orders in time.

The last time GCLA published the NRA-PVF candidate

ratings was in 2012. At that time there were many Democrat candidates with an A or B rating, and almost all returned the questionnaire to the NRA.

This is a shameful and scary turn of events.

If you are truly a supporter of the Second Amendment, please consider your vote carefully. Remember, elections have consequences.




